# Celebrating Creativity

On a typical cold July winter's day it was pleasing for me to see so many of our TOTT members, their families and friends come along to the opening of our latest exhibition 'A Creative Journey'.

31 of our member artists are exhibiting their work in one of our most high profile events - SALA; the South Australian Living Artists Festival, a statewide festival of visual art.

The Festival was established in 1998 to promote and celebrate the many talented visual artists in South Australia. SALA is a state-wide showcase and celebration of South Australia's living visual artists. Artists working at any stage of their career and in any medium are able to make, share and receive recognition for their work annually, during August. So, thankyou to our fabulous artists.

TOTT was fortunate to have Deputy Mayor of the Adelaide Hills Council, Nathan Daniell to officially open this year's SALA exhibition. As I soon discovered in my initial discussion with Nathan and in his opening remarks to the audience, Nathan is an enthusiastic supporter of the arts, especially in the Adelaide Hills. Nathan shared his views on how important he believes that local government is to groups like TOTT, helping to enable artists to develop and exhibit their work.

Whilst local government cannot provide the same financial support as State or Commonwealth governments, they can facilitate programs to help support volunteer art groups. One such program is the Community Grants scheme which this year has enabled TOTT to enhance the front garden area of the gallery with a streetscape art project.

Local artist Adrian Beacham has created the metal sculpture 'Angas' the goanna, as a feature attraction for TOTT and the town of Birdwood.

You will find an image of Angas later in this bulletin, however I encourage you to come along and meet Angas 'in person' soon - he highly recommends you also venture on into the warmth of the gallery to discover the other treasures inside!

In making this stunning exhibition piece, Barry Liddicoat has fulfilled a long-held desire to try steam bending timber.

The development involved making moulds for all of the different shapes, soaking and then steaming all of the timbers before gluing and clamping the laminates into the moulds again, to ensure each piece achieved the required shape.

From first drawing it full size on a sheet of custom wood, to being able to comfortably sit back and rock in the finished product took many weeks and in Barry's words "was very satisfying'.

# Introducing ANGAS...

At the opening of the 2023 TOTT SALA exhibition on Sunday 9th July, visitors and members were introduced to the TOTT Gallery's newest member, **Angas.** 

Angas is a 2.1 m long perentie (Australia's largest goanna) and is proudly looking out to welcome visitors to Birdwood and the Gallery.

He is the creation of local artist Adrian Beacham and was made from 135 recycled horseshoes. The surrounding garden has also had a revamp with some native plants and feature rocks, on a bed of wood chips.

This art installation was made possible with the aid of a community grant, funded by the Adelaide Hills Council.

After opening the exhibition Deputy Mayor Nathan Daniell took a closer look at Angas and was very impressed with the installation. He was thanked by TOTT gallery Chair John Ragless for the council's valuable, continued support of the gallery and local art.

Originally, Angas was named after the Angas Creek, that feeds into the Torrens.

On further investigation, we found that much of Blumberg (Birdwood) was settled on land leased from George Fife Angas who was instrumental in colonising South Australia.


His son, George French Angas, was an explorer, naturalist, painter and poet.


He produced many of South Australia's early paintings, a number of which are held in our National and state art galleries and museums.

It seems that Angas was indeed the perfect choice of name.


# SALA South Australian Living Artists Festival

## Frida and Diego: Love and Revolution

now showing

at The Art Gallery of SA

24 Jun – 17 Sep 2023 Galleries 22, 23, 25 Ticketed exhibition Tours at 3pm

Works by two of the most influential and loved artists of the twentieth century - Frida Kahlo and Diego Rivera - feature in this exhibition, alongside works by key Mexican contemporaries.

Love, passion and politics lie at the heart of *Frida & Diego*. The couple, radical in their art and politics, were at the forefront of the artistic and cultural avant-garde in post-revolution Mexico from the 1920s to the 1950s. Today they are worshipped globally for their fusion of traditional Mexican folk art and international modernism.

Featuring more than 150 works, including paintings, works on paper, photographs and period clothing, this major exhibition from the Jacques and Natasha Gelman Collection positions Kahlo and Rivera within the broader context of Mexican Modernism. It also includes works by Manuel and Lola Álvarez Bravo, Miguel Covarrubias, María Izquierdo, Carlos Mérida, David Alfaro Siqueiros and others.

Frida & Diego: Love & Revolution introduces Australian audiences to the intimate everyday stories of life and love as well as the grand narratives surrounding the political, social and cultural identity of Mexico and its peoples over the twentieth century.
