

"Creativity is seeing what everyone else has seen and thinking what no one else has thought" TOTT Chairperson John Ragless didn't hesitate when asked if he would perform the Official Opening of "Black, White and a Touch of Colour", the first exhibition on our 2024 exhibition calendar.

John re-countered to those gathered, the dilemma that faced Talia and Annette when they were presented with a last minute opportunity to join Simone in this



exhibition - How to produce enough pieces in just a few months, to fill the Gallery wall Space?

The decision to present a combined retrospective display was quickly make. The exhibition would include a selection of artworks that had been created over the past decade.

As prolific artists who both work from the same art space, the availability of enough artworks for the exhibition was not an issue. The problem was, which pieces to include in the exhibition and where were they all stashed?

Most artists are familiar with the abundance of hiding places that exist for storage of excess creations. Talia and Annette's search began under the beds, then progressed to the collection in the wardrobe and finally ended with the folders behind the lounge. A few of the pieces also came from the display on the walls!

Some of these artworks are new to the Gallery, versions of others have been seen before. Some are reproductions of past favourites. Others are prize winners.

For Talia it has been a desired opportunity to display a wide-ranging selection of her lino-prints all together in one exhibition.

The past few months have been a flurry of creative activity - designing and carving new pieces, printing and painting, then framing works for display.

John concluded his address by saying that he believes that it was during this time, that they came to the conclusion that their next joint event should be called **'Ten Thousand Hours'!**

Simone Linder-Paton Drawing inspiration from the textural qualities of Australian flora, my designs feature delicate floral and foliage imagery meticulously etched into the clay surface.

Through the technique of sgraffito, I carve delicate lines and patterns revealing the raw clay beneath and imbuing each piece with a tactile depth.

Using a limited colour palette invites contemplation, prompting the observer to delve into the subtleties of shape and pattern, allowing the inherent elegance of form and texture to take centre stage.

It is a visual meditation on the co-existence of simplicity and complexity. The juxtaposition of light and dark, positive and negative space, creates a visual rhythm that speaks to the interconnectedness of all living things.

Through my work, I hope to invite viewers to slow down, to pause, and to rediscover the profound beauty that surrounds us, even in the simplest forms.

Talia Dawson My fascination with flowers and the joy they bring seems to be an endless source for my art practice.

Recently I have been particularly inspired by native flora, studying the botanical constructs of individual plants before challenging myself to replicate what I see in a diverse way —using relief printmaking techniques and watercolour.


Through my work I aim to share my love of native blooms with others, placing a spotlight on the often-overlooked native flora that is endemic to Australia.

Annette Dawson I have always being creative and as a child growing up in Tea Tree Gully dreamed of being an artist. I was inspired to use acrylic paints as a 15 year old by a wonderful art teacher when studying art at Banksia Park High School.

Now 45 years later my artistic journey continues. My pathway over the years, has lead me to explore other mediums including silk painting and pastels. In 2018 my daughter Talia introduced me to the joys of printmaking and this medium now fits well with my travelling lifestyle.

I have always loved telling stories through my creativity . Each of my artworks represents threads of a memory that I have experienced. These threads are a part of the interwoven tapestry that reflects my life.

Applying medium to a canvas is just part of the process. It is having experienced the moment that brings an artwork to life.

We are also looking for facebook and google reviews as a way to increase our positions in the broader community.


As an artist in the gallery you have a vested interest in its success.



The grass isn't always greener

Angas our 2.1 m long perentie (Australia's largest goanna) has made many friends amongst locals and visitors to the gallery since his arrival mid last year.

To make him feel quite at home, the garden bed in front of the gift shop window was revamped to include native plants and grasses. As part of their normal growth cycle, some grasses dry off from time to time before re-generating.

Unfortunately, someone recently pulled out several clumps of grass, including the root stock and threw them to the back of the bed. The person may have thought they were helping with the gardening however this action means that the grass cannot re-generate.

To keep the bed tidy, dried grasses will be trimmed from time to time by designated maintenance members.





As Members are aware, the wall space within the gift shop is limited and we are therefor restricted as to the size of wall-art that we can display.

There are however two areas where we can accommodate larger pieces; namely the area behind the counter (*above the cupboard*) and in the gift shop window.

If you have larger pieces of wall-art within your portfolio, you are invited to join the roster for being featured in these spaces. There will be an 'expressions of interest list' for you to add your name to at the gallery from this Sunday.


Artist of the month - February Rosene Kotz

She finds experimenting with new materials inspires her creative process.



This month's article about what's happening at the **Art Gallery of SA** is adapted from Director, Rhana Devenport's introduction to the free AGSA publication **Exhibition Highlights 2024** which is available from the front desk in the AGSA Vestibule.



Much of the 2024 exhibition program draws imaginatively from AGSA's own collection. It conveys us to different lands and back through time.

Misty Mountain, Shining Moon, on now until 1 April 2024, (free entry) explores artists' representation of the Japanese landscape through the centuries, drawn principally from AGSA's extensive Asian collection. It offers a dialogue between artists and nature, expressed though their works of art from the 16th century to the present day and reveals a deep reverence for nature's splendour and veneration of the natural world as the abode of deities.

The 18th Adelaide Biennial of Australian Art: Inner Sanctum, 1 March - 2 June 2024 (free entry) showcases contemporary art from across the country. Curated by José Da Silva, it presents projects from 24 artists interested in the human condition. The idea of *an inner sanctum* is about the private or sacred spaces we create for ourselves and about *imagination* which allows us to see culture and society differently.

Brent Harris: Surrender & Catch, 6 July -20 October 2024, (free entry) considers the abstract and the psychological in the practice of one of Australia's foremost contemporary artists and is based on AGSA's significant holdings of his work. Brent Harris uses both figuration and abstraction, humour and the grotesque to examine psychological subject matter and give form to his feelings.

Re-imagining the Renaissance, 20 July 2024 - 13 April 2025, (free entry) reframes our understanding of the dramatic changes in European art from five centuries ago by examining AGSA's holdings of international paintings, sculpture, works on paper and decorative arts.

Radical Textiles 23 Nov 2024 - 30 March 2025 (ticketed exhibition) presents rarely seen and recently acquired works in the AGSA collection, augmented by loans from across the country. It unpicks social and political threads of revolution and innovation, protest and hope, interlaced in international and Australian fashion, textiles and experimental art practice over 150 years. The use of textiles by artists and designers has long been associated with moments of profound social and political change being used to express tension and transformation, resistance and activism and offering a way to mobilise social and political groups and build connections.

South Australian artists will also be featured during August 2024, with the works of **SALA focus artist Julia Robinson** and **Guildhouse Fellowship recipient Tom Phillips**.

AGSA is also sharing its inspiring offerings with the rest of the nation.

- The outstanding 2023 Tarnanthi exhibition *Vincent Namatjira: Australia in Colour* tours to the Canberra after it closes at AGSA in late January.
- Kungka Kuupu (from Tarnanthi 2022), is on its two-year national tour until June 2024.

Brent Harris: Surrender & Catch is being presented near Melbourne until March before coming to Adelaide.

And don't forget the regular events that will still offer enjoyment and opportunities to learn and be inspired:

START at the Gallery - held the first Sunday of every month - is a day of free family fun with art activities, tours and live performances.
